### PLEASE IF YOU HAVE NOT FILLED IN YOUR CENSUS, DO SO ASAP.

Every household will have received a letter around the 1st of March with a unique access code which enables them to complete the census online at <https://census.gov.uk>.

If a household cannot access the internet, or would like to complete a paper census form, the letter contains the main contact phone number 0800 141 2021 to call and ask for one.

This number also gives access to a telephone help service which can support both online and paper completion, or enable answers to be dictated to an official operator. You can also ask someone you trust to help you fill in the form or get an appointment at one of the local Census Support Centres.
