The reality of life is death. And not death to be avoided but death transformed. This is the great news of the Resurrection. The only trustworthy pattern of spiritual transformation is death and resurrection. As Christians we must carry our cross. Death and life are two sides of the same coin; you cannot have one without the other. Each time you surrender, each time you trust the dying, your faith is led to a deeper level and you discover a Larger Self underneath. You decide not to push yourself to the front of the line, and something much better happens in the back of the line.

You let go of your narcissistic anger, and you find that you start feeling much happier. You surrender your need to control your partner, and finally the relationship blossoms or ends. Yet each time it is a choice—and each time it is a kind of dying. It seems we only know what life is when we know what death is. Or try Paul's famous one-liner: "For me to live is Christ and to die is gain" (Philippians 1:21). Things change and grow by dying to their present state, but each time it is a risk. (R. Roher)

As spring follows winter and summer follows spring = dying, budding and blossoming.

May you blossom this Easter in the knowledge that Christ is risen and alive in you. "I live now, not I, but Christ lives in me."
